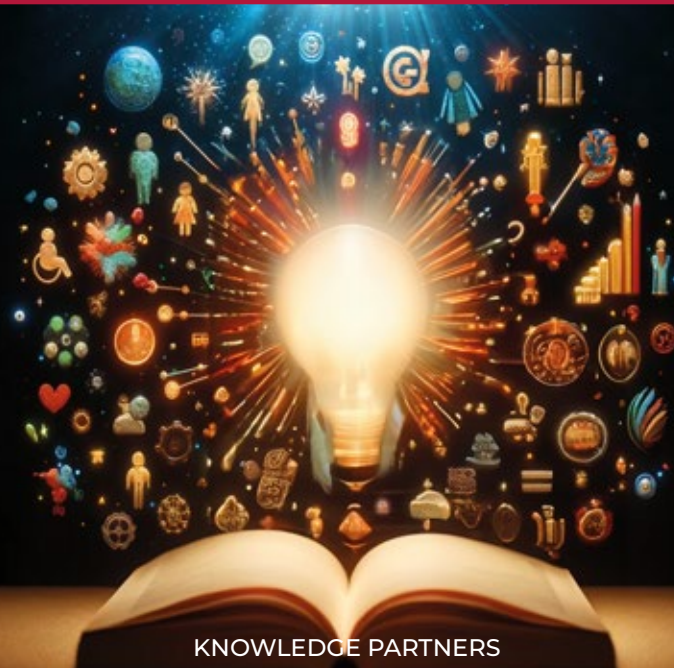

Objective of the Conference

The objectives for the Rishihood University Library International Conference on **Viksit Bharat 2047: The Role of Public Libraries in Preserving Indian Knowledge Systems and Integrating NEP 2020 into Community Libraries**

1. To explore the historical foundations of Indian knowledge Systems & their evolution, highlighting ancient Indian contributions to global knowledge and the development of knowledge preservation methods in India. The discussions will examine the role of public libraries as custodians of cultural heritage, focusing on the preservation of tangible and intangible cultural assets and the digitization of rare manuscripts and artifacts. Strategies for bridging knowledge gaps through community libraries will be discussed, with an emphasis on grassroots initiatives in rural library development and enhancing accessibility through mobile libraries.
2. To analyse the integration of traditional knowledge into the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, including curriculum development that incorporates Indian Knowledge Systems and pedagogical approaches for teaching traditional wisdom. Innovative technologies in library science, such as artificial intelligence, machine learning, virtual reality, and augmented reality applications in library management and services, will be explored. Additionally, the design of inclusive library spaces will be addressed, focusing on universal design principles for public libraries and creating child-friendly learning environments. The impact of NEP 2020 on library services will also be assessed, including challenges and opportunities in policy implementation and aligning library programs with NEP 2020 objectives.
3. To encourage community participation in library development through co-creation of library programs and effective volunteer management. The strengthening of collaborative networks among libraries will be a focus, emphasizing inter-library loan systems, resource sharing, and national and international partnerships. Best global practices in public library services will be shared, presenting case studies from developed and developing nations and adapting international models to the Indian context. Success stories of transformative library initiatives will be showcased, assessing the impact of community-driven projects and exploring ways to scale up successful local library models.
4. To address challenges in the digital preservation of Indian Knowledge Systems, including the digitization of ancient texts and oral traditions, and developing long-term digital storage and retrieval solutions. Libraries will be positioned as lifelong learning centres, focusing on adult literacy programs and skill development initiatives. The integration of indigenous knowledge into library services will be explored, preserving tribal and folk knowledge through collaborative projects with indigenous communities.

To develop inclusive library services for diverse populations, including multilingual collections, translation services, and assistive technologies for differently abled users.

5. To explore the role of public libraries in promoting digital citizenship through information literacy programs and e-governance facilitation. The promotion of sustainable development through library initiatives will be discussed, focusing on eco-friendly practices and environmental education. Challenges related to the urban-rural library divide will be addressed through innovative outreach programs and technology-enabled services for remote communities. The development of standardized metrics for measuring library impact and performance in the Indian context will also be considered.
6. To promote multilingualism and cultural diversity in libraries by building inclusive multilingual collections & fostering cross-cultural understanding. The development of a policy framework for integrating libraries into NEP 2020 will be discussed, including legislative support and national standards for library services. A comprehensive policy framework for integrating Indian Knowledge Systems into NEP 2020 will also be created, focusing on curriculum development, research and innovation, and capacity building in IKS.

- Papers should be in MS Word format
- Use A4 page size, single-spaced, 12-point Times New Roman font.
- Minimum word limit 3000 words & Maximum word limit of 45000 - 5000 words per paper.

Formatting Guidelines

- Kindly include the author's full name, designation, affiliations, email & Mobile Number.
- Please do not add any other biographical details of the author apart from what has been mentioned above.
- Papers must be written in English for acceptance in the conference. Follow the APA 8th edition citation format.

Review Process

- Papers will be reviewed by the Review Committee.
- Reviewer comments, if any, will be communicated to authors for necessary action.

Copyright and Originality

- Submit a signed copyright form along with the paper.
- The paper must be original and unpublished elsewhere

Presentation at the Conference

- Selected papers will be invited for presentation.
- Maximum duration of each presentation shall not exceed 10 minutes.
- Presentations can be made via poster or Power Point.
- Presentations will be followed by remarks by the chairperson of the session.

Academic and Research Practices

- Papers must follow best academic and research practices.
- Improper structure may lead to rejection.

Publication

- All accepted papers will be published in an edited book with ISBN by a reputed publisher.
